Role Purpose

As a member of the wider Place Directorate Extended Management team, the Head of Commercial Development is responsible for the Council's Commercial position within the £600m Harrow Strategic Development Partnership (HSDP) project and will advise on other development opportunities for Harrow.

Harrow Council has a 50/50 share in the Harrow Strategic Development Partnership (HSDP) with Wates Residential. This ambitious programme will deliver over 1200 new homes and associated infrastructure. The HSDP is structured to deliver on the Council's strategic objectives, ensuring the value of sites are optimised.

The role will deliver value to the Council through the application of commercial knowledge and experience in the construction industry, to ensure that the HSDP and the Council's other development projects achieve best value.

The role line manages the Development Finance Business Partner and Regeneration Coordinator.

Tasks / responsibilities

- 3. Facilitate the realisation of opportunities by providing specialist advice and guidance for commercial, budgeting, business planning and modelling.
- 4. Ensure commercial controls are consistently monitored and tested across each stage at project review level, and at key project gateways and report accurately to DMT as required.
- 5. Lead project and commercial risk management for the Council's regeneration programme of over £600m in value and support the wider Council as well as Development Managers and Programme Leads as they implement. Continually keep under review.
- 6. Maintain up to date knowledge and a database on market procurement, frameworks and supply chain engagement strategies to provide value for money.
- 7. Develop Commercial opportunities within the Council by the active promotion of the Council agenda.
- 8. Set a strategic vision for all commercial projects, to deliver required outputs to high quality standards within agreed timescales and budgets.
- 9. Provide financial analysis to inform the development of new opportunities, including investment analysis and advice on pricing, costing and profitability.
